





ASSESSMENT POLICY

EXAMINATION TOPICS

(THREE EXAMINATIONS: TERM 1, TERM 2, TERM 3)

YEAR GROUP	EXAMINATION TOPICS
Year 1 & 2	No written examinations. Grades will be based on Continuous Assessment process/program
Year 3 to 9	Each Term Examination will be based on the prescribed topics covered during the Term.
Year 10	In Term1,2 & 3- All topics covered during the Year up until and the date of the examination.
Year 11	In Term 1 -Full topics of Year 10 and topics covered in Term 1 in Year 11. Mock exam – Full topics of Year 10 and 11 will be included. These examinations are only internal assessments and end of year results will be based on the results published by CAIE.
Year 12 & 13	In Term 1 – Topics covered during the Term until the date of Examination Mock Exam - Full Year Topics. These examinations are only internal assessments and end of year result will be based on the Results published by CAIE.

PROMOTION POLICY KG to YEAR 2

KG to Year 2: all students will be promoted automatically unless there are any major learning difficulties or attendance deficiencies,

YEAR 3 TO YEAR 9

1: - ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT:

- Students must have at least 80% attendance to be eligible to appear in the final examination. Attendance will be calculated from the first day of the academic year or from the date of joining in case the joining date is after the first day of the academic year.
- Any student whose attendance is below 80% will have to repeat the year.
- However, if a student is absent due to illness and provides a proper/authorized medical
 certificate accepted by the Principal, the student's absence will be counted as present in
 calculating the percentage of attendance. In such cases student's attendance record will not
 be affected by the authorized absence.

- 2: END OF TERM MARKS: At the end of every term, the cumulative marks of Homework (HW), Continuous Assessment (CA) and end of term examination will be arrived at and shown as individual mark as per the weightage as shown below.
 - a) There will be Examination at the end of every Term.
 - b) Structure of **Term End marks** in every Term. Year 3 to 9

CA 5% marks, Homework 5%, Examination 65%; Behaviour 25%

(Students who submit their Homework on the same day when the lesson is taught, will be eligible for a maximum of 5 marks as bonus marks in the Term End Examination mark of the subject. This bonus marks will be within the 65% of Term end mark)

3: **FINAL CUMULATIVE MARK**: Final Cumulative Mark at the end of the Year will be calculated as below. YEAR 3 TO 9

CA -5% – Average mark scored in the three Terms;

Home Work - **5**% - Average mark scored in the three Terms -

Examination Mark -65% – Average of all the three terms examination marks;

Behaviour Mark -25% -- Average of all the three Terms. Lowest mark will be zero.

Final Cumulative mark - 100% - The final result will be judged based on this Final Cumulative mark of every subject at the end of the academic year.

Maximum 1% moderation will be given to get minimum pass of cumulative score of 50% in every subject.

Separate Progress Report will be issued for the Extra Curricular Activities attended by the Student.

Year 10

1: - ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT:

- Students must have at least 80% attendance to be eligible to appear in the final examination.
 Attendance will be calculated from the first day of the academic year or from the date of joining in case the joining date is after the first day of the academic year.
- Any student whose attendance is below 80% will have to repeat the year.
- However, if a student is absent due to illness and provides a proper/authorized medical certificate accepted by the Principal, the student's absence will be counted as present in calculating the percentage of attendance. In such cases student's attendance record will not be affected by the authorized absence.
- 2: END OF TERM MARKS: At the end of every Term, the cumulative marks of Homework, Continuous Assessment and end of term examination will be arrived at as per the weightage as shown below.
 - a) There will be Examination at the end of every Term.

b) Structure of Cumulative marks- in every Term. Year 10

CA 5 %, Homework 5%, Examination 65%; Behaviour 25%

(Students who submit their Homework on the same day when the lesson is taught, will be eligible for a maximum of 5 marks as bonus marks in the Term End Examination mark of the subject. This bonus marks will be within the 65% of Term end mark).

4: **FINAL CUMULATIVE MARK**: Final Cumulative Mark at the end of the Year will be calculated as below.

5. PROMOTION POLICY - YEAR 10

Students have to score minimum 50% marks in every subject to pass.

Year 11,12 & 13

1: - ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT:

Students with less than 80% attendance (from the date of first day of attendance) <u>as on the date</u> of applying for CAIE entry will not be allowed to do enroll for CAIE Examination. Absence with medical certificate will be treated as present to calculate the percentage.

2: END OF YEAR RESULT:

- (1) End of Year Result will be based on the Grades scored by students in Cambridge Assessment International Examination (CAIE).
- (2) Examinations conducted by the School is only an internal assessment and the grades scored by student in internal examinations will not decide their pass/failure.

- (3) There is no overall pass mark in Year 11, 12 & 13. Those who scored Grade 'U' or 'X' in all subjects in the internal Mock assessments will be reported as FAILED in school for the record of Ministry of Education, Qatar.
- (4) Admission to Year 12 & 13 will solely depend on the subjects opted by the students and the grades scored by them in IGCSE/AS level Examinations (conduct by CAIE) respectively and subject to the admission criteria prevailing in the School during each academic year.
- (5) Every school fix its own policy from year to year on the basis of CAIE grades in giving admission in Year 12 and 13.

Note: Absence during Term End Examinations: (Applicable for all classes)

If a student is absent during the Term End Examinations, he will receive a zero mark for that particular exam.

Exceptions: Students who are absent due to illness

- If the absence is due to illness, the student must provide a valid medical certificate that is acceptable to the Principal. The medical certificate will be subjected to verification and if it is found to be not genuine, the student can be terminated from the school.
- It's important for students and their parents to communicate with the Parent Relation Officer of the school in writing in the case of an illness-related absence. Valid medical certificate must be submitted to the school within three days from the date of the absence due to illness. This is to ensure that the student's absence is properly recorded and the necessary arrangements is made.
- If the medical certificate is deemed valid, the following clauses will apply:

1- Term 1 – Every Year

If a student is absent in a particular subject for the End of Term 1 examinations due to illness and his medical certificate is valid and accepted by the school, the corresponding percentage of the average marks scored by the student for that subject in internal assessments such as (CAS) and (HW) will be given as the Term End exam mark. The maximum marks that can be awarded in this case is 50% of the examination total marks (i.e. 32.5 marks).

2- Term 2 & 3 - Every Year: -

- If a student is absent in a particular subject for the End of Term 2 or 3 examinations due to illness and his medical certificate is valid and accepted by the school, the student will be given one retest opportunity to benefit the student.
- The school will schedule a common date and time for all eligible students to take the retest. The school will inform the parents of eligible students about the date and time of the retest through e-communication, SMS, and Gazette.
- If a student is absent for the retest exam even with medical certificate, he will not be allowed to take another retest and the score for that particular exam will be considered as a zero.

SCHOOL RULES



- Students MUST be punctual in arriving to lessons.
- Students who leave lessons for any reason must be in possession of a pass from the teacher.
- Students MUST be well-behaved on the bus and MUST accept the authority of the driver and the conductor.
- Students MUST have an appropriate school bag, pencil case that contains pen(s),
 pencil(s), pencil sharpener, coloured pen(s) / pencil(s), books required for the day, clothing required for activity.
- Valuable items MUST not be brought into school. The school will not be responsible for these items.
- No obscene literature or bad language will be tolerated within the school premises.
- Students MUST not graffiti on the doors, damage the school property including plants and trees inside or outside the school grounds.
- Chewing gum is not permitted within school.
- Students are allowed to wear a wrist watch and girls are permitted one small stud in the lobe of each pierced ear. No other jewelry is permitted. Students are not allowed to have long nails, nail varnish on their fingernails or any other makeup.
- Students arrive late must obtain a late-entry slip in order to be allowed into class.
- Students MUST wear the correct school uniform and be neatly dressed at all times.
- Hairstyles for boys and girls MUST be appropriate and the use of gel and having spiked hair is not
 acceptable. Hair must not be "coloured". Girls' long hair MUST be tied back.
- Personal cleanliness and hygiene is expected from everyone.
- Glass containers for food and drink and cans of drink may not be brought into school.
- Students MUST line up in a quiet and orderly manner before being allowed to enter a room.
- Students will not be allowed to leave the school during working hours. However, in the case of an emergency, written permission MUST be sought from higher authorities.
- Parents /Guardians MUST inform the school if their child/children is/are going to be absent from school.



- Applications for extended absence from school MUST be submitted in advance to the Head of Section who will refer it to the Principal for consideration.
- Students MUST go to the nurse if they feel unwell. Students cannot go home, because of illness, without the permission of the nurse.
- Cheating is unacceptable and any student caught using unfair means to undertake a test / examination will be removed from that examination / test and a 'zero' grade awarded.
- Library books MUST be returned on time. The student will be asked to pay the replacement cost if a library book is lost or not returned.
- Any damage to school property will be charged against the Cautionary Deposit.
- Please note: Students that are in receipt of three (3) detentions for unruly and / or unacceptable behaviour will be asked to leave the school.

MOBILE PHONES, CAMERA AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students must not bring mobiles, cameras etc. into school. They may leave them in school office and collect them after school.

If students are found with cameras, mobiles etc., the equipment will be confiscated for a minimum period of one academic year. Parents may collect the equipment after signing a declaration.



SCHOOL POLICY ON STUDENTS WHO COME LATE

- A: Students (other than KG) who arrive after 7.15 am and before start of lesson1 will be considered as late. Students who arrive after lesson 1 and before start of lesson 2, 1^{st,} 2nd and 3rd time (monthly basis) will be detained at the School Admin office and will be allowed to go to class only in Lesson 2.
- Students coming start of Lesson 2 or after Lesson 1 will not be allowed to attend for the day. They will be sent back with their parents or with the person who escorted them when they came. If the parent is not available to pick them up, students will be sent to Counsellor's room.

Exception: Students with valid reasons (with supporting evidence).

B: Students who arrive late (after 7:15am) 4th time:


- Student will not be allowed to enter school for one day.

NOTE:

- 1. Late arrival will be counted on a monthly basis.
- 2. Late arrival on account of emergency reasons, with supporting documents will be excluded from these procedures.

STUDENTS WITHOUT SCHOOL UNIFORM & ID CARD

- Student will not be allowed to attend school without proper school uniform and ID Card.
- All students must wear the regular shirts, trousers and plain black shoes.
- Sports shoes are not permitted for normal school.
- Girls must tie back long hair. Boys must keep shirt "tucked in"



- Boys may wear one wristwatch only.
- PE/ House shirts and school tracksuit trousers are only allowed on PE days.
- House shirt, school tracksuit bottoms and non-marking sports shoes without studs must be worn for all PE lessons.
- Headscarf must be black, white or cream with no decoration.





REMEDIAL SYSTEM - STUDENTS NOT IN PE UNIFORM

- Students who do not have proper flat sports shoes (non-marking shoes without studs) are not allowed to enter the sports hall or to participate in PE activities.
- Students who do not wear the proper PE uniform are not allowed to enter the school sports hall or to participate in PE activities.
- Students who do not have their school ID will not be allowed inside sports hall, Gym or in PE activities.
- All students as mentioned above without PE uniform and flat shoes during PE lessons will be sent to detention room through PRO during the period and cannot attend PE, Art, Music classes for next 21 days.


CLASS WORK/HOMEWORK

Presentation of work is always important: -

- Do not allow your books to be decorated with stickers or graffiti.
- Always hand written work with an underlined date and title.
- Try to draft your work and then check for content, organisation and accuracy. Rework as necessary, then write-up neatly.
- Take care with layout making proper use of margins and indented paragraphs. Write in blue or black ballpoint and only use colour when this is necessary to aid presentation. Do not use erasable pens.
- Proof-read all work for spelling, punctuation and grammar. Make sure your work is correct otherwise your marks and grades will suffer in all subjects.

HOMEWORK

- Homework is both important and necessary.
- Homework done regularly throughout secondary school can be equivalent to an additional year of study!
- Try to do your homework at the same time each day in a quiet place where you are free from distraction. You are likely to achieve more by working regularly for relatively short periods than in a single long session when your concentration will lapse.



Purpose of Homework:

- To provide a link between school and home
- To emphasise the link between what is learned in school and real life (for example after a Mathematics lesson about weight, the children may be asked to go home and find the weight amounts written on different packets).
- To extend an area of knowledge or a skill
- To reinforce an area of knowledge or a skill
- Homework should not involve tackling new or unfamiliar topics.



Stay away from any illegal drugs! These change the way our brain works and can permanently damage your brain.



FIRST AID

It is important that everybody knows what to do in an emergency, if someone is injured or unwell.

ALWAYS



- Get someone to fetch an adult as quickly as possible.
- If there is no one with you who can fetch an adult, dial 999 and ask for ambulance
- When dialing 999 speak slowly and clearly. Answer all the questions as well as you can.
- While you are waiting for help to arrive, speak to the person who is unwell and keep them calm.

NEVER

- Try to move anything that has hurt their neck or back.
- Put yourself in danger, get help instead.
- Ignore a head injury even if the person says that they are OK.
- Dial 999 unless it is a real emergency.



Hypoglycemia - Diabetes

What causes a hypo?

- Too much insulin.
- A delayed or missed meal or snack.
- Not enough food, especially carbohydrates.
- Unplanned or strenuous exercise.
- Drinking large quantities of alcohol or alcohol without food.
- Sometimes, there is no obvious cause.

Watch out for:

Hunger, trembling or shakiness, sweating, anxiety or irritability.

Fast pulse or palpitations, tingling, glazed eyes.

Mood change, especially angry or aggressive behaviour.

Lack of concentration, vagueness and drowsiness.

Do:

Immediately give something sugary, a quick-acting carbohydrate such as one of the following:

- Three or more glucose tablets
- A glass of fruit juice
- Five sweets, e.g. jelly babies
- GlucoGel

The exact amount needed will vary from person to person and will depend on individual needs and circumstances. This will be sufficient for a pump user but for persons who inject insulin, a longeracting carbohydrate will be needed to prevent the blood glucose dropping again.

- Roll/sandwich or portion of fruit.
- One individual mini pack of dried fruit.
- Cereal bar or two biscuits e.g. digestive, garibaldi, ginger or nuts.
- Or a meal if it is due.

If the person still feels hypo after 15 minutes, something sugary should again be given. When the person has recovered, give them some starchy food as above. If the person is unconscious, do not give them anything to eat or drink; call for an ambulance and contact the emergency contact.

Asthma

Common signs of an asthma attack

- Coughing, shortness of breath
- Wheezing, feeling tight in the chest
- Being unusually quiet, difficulty speaking in full sentences
- Sometimes, younger children express feeling tight in the chest as a tummy ache.



Do

- Keep calm
- Encourage a person to sit up and slightly forward do not have them or lay them down
- Make sure the person takes two puffs of a reliever inhaler (usually blue)
 immediately preferably through a spacer
- Ensure tight clothing is loosened
- Reassure the person

If there is no immediate improvement

 Continue to make the person takes one puff of reliever inhaler every minute for five minutes or until their symptoms improve.

After a minor asthma attack

Minor asthma should not interrupt the involvement of a person with their school work. When the person feels better, they can return to school activities. In the case that the sufferer is a student, parents must always be told if their child has had an asthma attack.

Important things to remember in an asthma attack

- Never leave a person having an asthma attack.
- If the person does not have their inhaler and/or spacer with them, send another teacher or person to the classroom or assigned room to get them spare inhaler and/or spacer.
- In the case of a student, contact the student's parents immediately after calling the ambulance/doctor.
- A member of staff should always accompany a pupil taken to hospital by ambulance and stay with them until their parent arrives.
